- It was bottled in South Africa – so it is 100% South African!

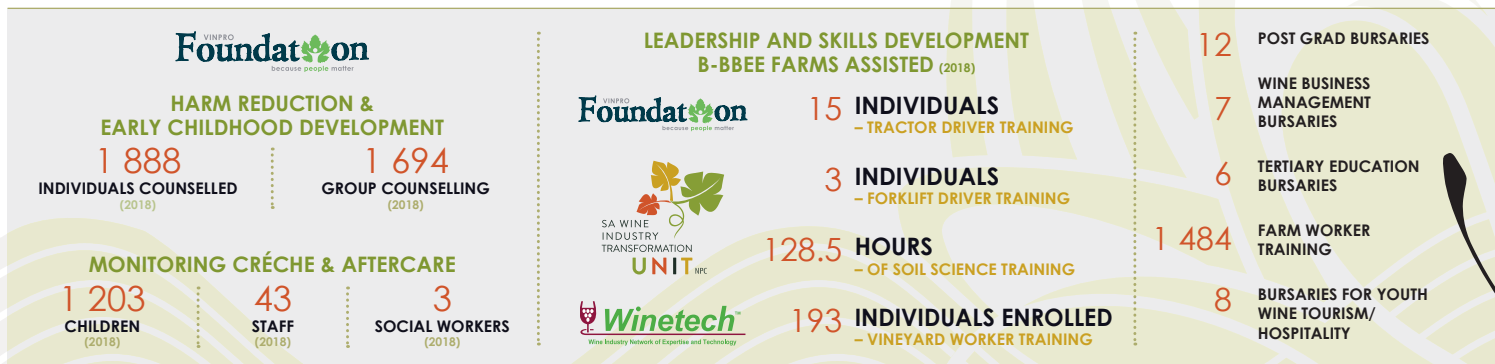

# HERE'S HOW

**SINCE 1974, OUR WINE OF ORIGIN SCHEME** guarantees the information on the label that states where the grapes came from, the vintage year and the variety or varieties ([www.sawis.co.za](http://www.sawis.co.za))

- South Africa introduced guidelines on sustainability as early as 1998. Roughly 94% of the growers and cellars stick to the guidelines ([www.ipw.co.za](http://www.ipw.co.za))
- These guidelines are constantly improved, and independent auditors audit the farms and cellars. If the farms pass the audit, they can use the sustainability seal ([www.swsa.co.za](http://www.swsa.co.za))
- South African producers are extremely conservation conscious. In the past five years, they have set aside nearly 120,000 hectares as conservation land, and committed to restoring it back to its original nature.



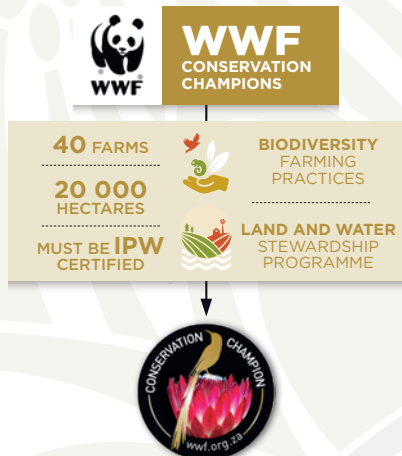
# SUSTAINABLE WINE SOUTH AFRICA

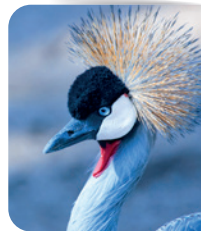

- Nearly all of South Africa's wine is grown in an area called the Cape Floral Kingdom (CFK)
- There are six Floral Kingdoms - ours is the smallest and richest in the world, and a World Heritage site
- It is a recognised biodiversity hotspot, with more than 10 000 different species of plants growing here - not to mention the birds, animals and insects.
- 70% of these plants don't grow anywhere else in the world.
- South African vineyard owners have embraced the huge responsibility of growing wine in such a special place - they are putting vast tracts of land into conservation ([www.swsa.co.za](http://www.swsa.co.za))
- The farmers are getting rid of water-guzzling alien (foreign) plants. This restores wet lands and sources the rivers ([www.wwf.org.za/waterneural](http://www.wwf.org.za/waterneural))
- Where our vines grow there is more diverse life per square meter than anywhere else on the planet.
